

Rutherglen Freemasons celebrate 150 years

Rutherglen Freemasons and their ladies gathered at the local Star Hotel, to celebrate the 150th Anniversary of Freemasonry in Rutherglen.

Alexandra Lodge No. 1115 EC, (formed under the English Constitution), first met at the Star Hotel in 1865, but went into abeyance 20 years later. The present Rutherglen Lodge No. 188 opened in its own building in High Street in 1902 and is still going strong.

Stan Clarke OAM, delivered a talk detailing the early history of Masonic activity around the Rutherglen District, at the conclusion of which, he presented a copy of his updated Masonic history of North East Victoria. Lodge Secretary VWBro. Bill Black followed with a presentation of historical articles from Alexandra Lodge. These included the original charter, by-laws, appearance book, a copy of the first summons, and the stamp press for the common seal.


Freemasons Victoria is On The Move
