Dallas Brooks Centre Announcement

The Board of General Purposes has entered into an agreement for the redevelopment of the Masonic Centre of Victoria site, conditional upon members ratifying the Board's decision.

Grand Master MWBRo. Bob Jones has said that this is, 'good news for the future of Freemasonry in Victoria. The strategy also ensures the maintenance of a high standard of meeting places, which supports the Freemasons Victoria brand and recognition.'

Grand Secretary and CEO RWBro. Peter Henshall says that, 'This is perhaps the most exciting decision for establishing the future of Freemasonry in Victoria that any of us are likely to see in our days as Freemasons.'



Over 150 members attended the information sessions at Dallas Brooks Centre on 28 November and 12 December 2012 (pictured above and right). The vote on whether to ratify the redevelopment deal with Mirvac will take place at the December Quarterly Communication on Wednesday 19 December 2012.

Details of the redevelopment proposal, along with the information presented during the member information sessions, can be found on the members' section of the Freemasons Victoria website.





If approved, the redeveloped Masonic Centre will allow Freemasons Victoria to provide appropriate meeting spaces for members and efficiently utilise its facilities while maintaining its historic flagship presence in East Melbourne.

The New Masonic Centre will be a home for up to 20 Craft Lodges and 18 other orders in contemporary facilities. Freemasons Victoria will own its space, including car parks, under strata title.


